- April 24 is observed as the International Day of Multilateralism and Diplomacy for Peace every year.
- An Indian-origin Japanese has been elected to Tokyo's Edogawa Ward assembly, becoming the first Indian to win an election in Japan.
- A 15-year old Indian-origin boy, Ranveer Singh Sandhu has been lauded as Britain's youngest accountant after setting up a successful firm while still at school.
- Around 3.10 crore small farmers have so far received the first tranche of Rs 2,000 each under the PM-Kisan scheme.
- Indian will stop importing crude oil from Iran following the US move to end sanction waivers and will use alternate supply sources such as Saudi Arabia.
- The government has extended the ban on import of milk and its products, including chocolates, from China.
- Tata Global Beverages Ltd (TGBL) has entered into a non-binding agreement to acquire the branded tea business of Dhunseri Tea and Industries Ltd, for up to Rs 101 crore.
- Jhulan Goswami, world's leading wicket-taker in women's one-day internationals, was awarded the Best Sportsperson award by the Calcutta Sports Journalists Club.
- West Bengal government's 'Utkarsh Bangla' scheme was awarded the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) award of the United Nations.
- India claimed one gold, one silver, and bronze at the Asian Wrestling Championship in China's Xian on April 23, 2019.
